

# Third Conditional

The third conditional is used for **unreal situations in the past**.

It is also used for **dreams that will not come true**.

<b>IF CLAUSE = PAST PERFECT</b> <i>If I had won the lottery,</i>	<b>MAIN CLAUSE = WOULD + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE</b> <i>I would have travelled the world.</i>
<b>RESULT = WOULD + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE</b> <i>I would have travelled the world</i>	<b>IF CLAUSE = PAST PERFECT</b> <i>if I had won the lottery.</i>
