### Modal Verbs: Quick Guide

- 1. **Can** - ability, permission (informal), possibility.
  - "I can swim." / "Can I go?"
- 1. **May** - polite permission, possibility (formal).
  - "May I leave?" / "It may rain."
- 1. **Must** - strong obligation, certainty.
  - "You must stop." / "She must be home."
- 1. **Should** - advice, recommendation.
  - "You should study."
- 1. **Will** - future actions, promises, willingness.
  - "I will help you."
