POSITIVE	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
I had eaten.	I hadn't eaten.	Had I eaten?
He had eaten.	He hadn't eaten.	Had he eaten?
She had eaten.	She hadn't eaten.	Had she eaten?
It had eaten.	It hadn't eaten.	Had it eaten?
We had eaten.	We hadn't eaten.	Had we eaten?
You had eaten.	You hadn't eaten.	Had you eaten?
They had eaten.	They hadn't eaten.	Had they eaten?
