Marshmallow bites

We all try to eat healthy food but sometimes it is nice to have something sweet. Make these little bites for a sugary treat.

Ingredients:

some chocolate, some marshmallows, some sweets

**Utensils:**

a small bowl, a big bowl, some small cake cases, a spoon

Steps:

- 1 Break the chocolate into small pieces. Put them in a small bowl. Put the small bowl into a big bowl of hot water — be careful! Stir the chocolate until it melts.
- 2 Pour some chocolate into each small cake case.
- 3 Put a marshmallow into the chocolate before it cools.
- 4 Put a dot of chocolate on the top of each marshmallow. Stick a sweet on top of the chocolate.
- 5 Put the marshmallows in the fridge so the chocolate can cool. Enjoy!
