Structure:

👉 *IF* + past perfect → *would have* + past participle

Use: To imagine different outcomes for things that didn't happen (unreal past).

Examples (related to Emma's story):

- *If* Emma **had taken** the job, she **wouldn't have** started the non-profit.
- *If* her grandfather **hadn't gotten** sick, she **would have** left for New York.
- She **would have** lived in New York *if* she **had accepted** the offer.
