► What is the past continuous?

We use **past continuous** to talk about actions that were **happening at a specific time in the past**.

► How do we form it?

was/were + verb + -ing

Subject Verb To Be Verb + -ing

I was eating

He/She/It was flying

You/We/They were waiting

► Examples from the story:

- ◆ *While we **were flying** over the Alps, the plane **was shaking**.*
- ◆ *My little sister **was screaming**, and my mom **was holding** her hand.*

- ◆ *The airline was looking for them.*
- ◆ *While we were checking in my dad was arguing with the receptionist.*

These actions were **happening at the same time** in the past.
