FIRE



Was fire invented or discovered? Fire wasn't really invented – it existed without humans. But when early humans invented ways of controlling fire and making it themselves, it changed the way they lived. They could stay warm, protect themselves and, perhaps most importantly, cook food. No-one is certain when humans first started using fire, but it was somewhere between two million and 125,000 years ago.

THE WHEEL



The earliest examples of the wheel come from around 5,500 years ago. They were from an area at the eastern end of the Mediterranean Sea, then called Mesopotamia. They were wooden and they were used to make pots. Wheeled vehicles came along a few hundred years later, when people worked out how to fix wheels to carts or chariots. The wheel is such an amazing invention because it isn't related to anything in nature.




