Animals and Language

It is sometimes said that animals use language. Certainly, some animal species have developed sophisticated ways of communicating with one another.

However, animals communicate differently from humans. When animals make a sound, such as giving a bark or a call, it is in reaction to what is happening around them. An alarm call shows fear. A hunger call shows they want food. But animals cannot make a sound like ‘I was scared yesterday’ or ‘I’ll be hungry tomorrow’. Only humans are capable of doing that.

Zoologists have had success in teaching language to animals. Through some experiments, chimpanzees have been taught to use hand signs to give information. Some have even put

signs together in order to make short sentences. However, this takes a huge amount of training.
