Hints:

allow** and **cause** are usually followed by TO	(allow me *to go*)
make** is followed by the V1 without to	(make me *cry*)
help** can be followed by a V1 or TO + verb	(help me *study* OR help me *to study*)
enable** and **encourage** are followed by TO + verb	(enable me *to work*)
teach** and **force** are followed by object + TO + verb	(teach me *to swim*)
prevent** is followed by object + FROM + verb-ING	(prevent me *from falling*)
make me do something** is usually negative	(make me cry = I don't want to cry)
force me TO do something is usually negative	(force me to wear a uniform = I don't want to wear it)
let me do something** is usually positive	(let me go out = I want to go out)
