Water pollution is one of the most serious environmental problems in the world today. It occurs when harmful substances like chemicals, plastics, and waste enter rivers, lakes, and oceans. These pollutants often come from factories, farms, and households.

Aquatic life—such as fish, turtles, and plants that live in the water—depends on clean water to survive. When the water is polluted, it becomes difficult for these organisms to breathe, eat, and grow. For example, plastic waste can be mistaken for food by sea animals, which can harm or even kill them. Toxic chemicals in the water can poison fish and cause diseases in both animals and humans.

Water pollution also affects the balance of underwater ecosystems. Algae may grow uncontrollably due to pollution from fertilizers. This blocks sunlight and uses up oxygen in the water, making it hard for other creatures to survive.

It is important for us to protect our water sources by reducing plastic use, properly disposing of waste, and supporting clean-up efforts. Everyone can play a part in saving aquatic life and keeping our planet healthy.
