

PRACTICE: Parts of Speech - Adjectives, Nouns, and Verbs

Parts of Speech are categories that words fall into based on their function in a sentence. Today, we will focus on four parts of speech:

- 1. Pronoun:**
A word that takes the place of a noun.
Examples: *he, she, it, they, we, you, I*
- 2. Adverb:**
A word that describes or modifies a verb, an adjective, or another adverb. It often tells how, when, where, or to what extent.
Examples: *quickly, yesterday, here, very, easily*
- 3. Preposition:**
A word that shows the relationship between a noun (or pronoun) and another word in the sentence.
Examples: *in, on, at, under, over, between, through*
- 4. Conjunction:**
A word that connects words, phrases, or clauses.
Examples: *and, but, or, because, although*

Instructions: Read each sentence carefully. The word in **bold** is the one you need to classify. Choose:
