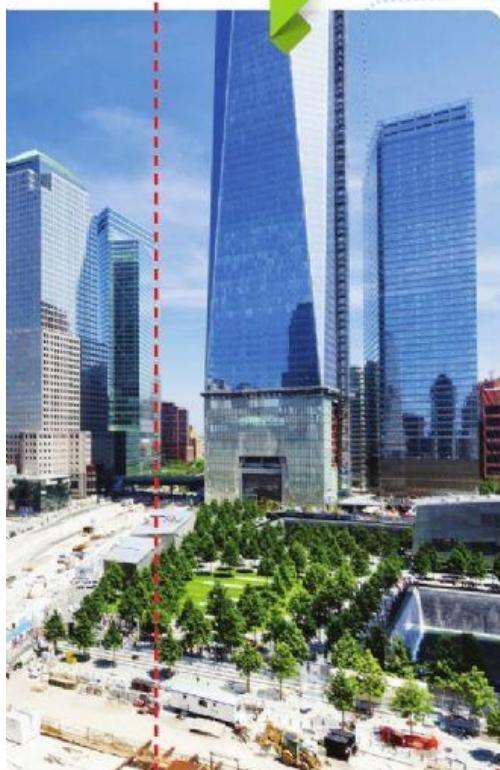
## Match the columns.
