I Anastasia Pagonis grew up in New York. Even from a very young age, she always loved the water. As she got older, her dream was to participate in freestyle swimming competitions. Just before her fourteenth birthday, Pagonis joined a swim team, but not long afterwards, she lost
5 her vision. It took her a long time to deal with her terrible sadness and depression, but Pagonis learned to accept what had happened. She finally understood that she was blind and wondered what she was going to do with her life.

II Pagonis decided to quit the
10 team because her teammates treated her badly. They didn't want a blind swimmer on their team. Pagonis experienced a real crisis. But in time she was able to go back
15 to competitive swimming. Her family gave her enormous support and she was also aided by her amazing coach.

III Pagonis's goal was to compete in international paraswimming events. Parasports events are sports events where disabled athletes*
20 from around the world compete against each other. In 2018, Pagonis competed in Italy, and won a silver and bronze medal. In 2020, she won two gold medals in Australia.

IV When Pagonis realized that her experiences could help her make a positive impact on others, she joined social media. She wanted to help
25 people the way that she had needed help. Pagonis was getting messages from her fans telling her that they were being bullied in school. They said that she had helped them deal with their problem and realize how much they were worth.

V Pagonis's aim is to eventually compete in the Paralympics. She is
30 now living and training for the Paralympic Games in Tokyo at the Olympic & Paralympic Training Center in Colorado, USA. Pagonis believes that people need to have faith because if they don't try, they will never know. She tells people never to give up on their dreams.
