Using Smartphones to Measure Height

Smartphones today have many useful and surprising features. A great example is found in the new Apple iPhone 14 Pro, which can measure a person’s height. By using the Measure app, you simply point your phone camera at someone, and it will instantly show their height. The person must stand in front of the camera, from head to toe, for the result to be accurate. Although you can measure yourself in a mirror, it’s better to ask a friend for help.

The app works through AR (augmented reality) and a special sensor in the phone called LiDAR. LiDAR stands for “light imaging, detection, and ranging.” It sends out light pulses that bounce off the person and return to the sensor. The time it takes helps the app calculate the person’s height. This is similar to how 3D laser scanning works. While the app is advanced, some still joke that it’s not as fun as marking height on a door. Still, it shows how far technology has come in helping us in everyday life.
