About penguins

A new penguin chick born to the parents of a stolen baby penguin will play an important role in the conservation scheme. When it reaches an appropriate age, it will be sent to South Africa and released into the wild.

The chick was hatched two weeks ago, on 14 February, to penguins named Kyala and Oscar. Their first offspring, Toga, was just three months old when it was stolen from Amazon World Zoo on the Isle of Wight. Thieves broke in and stole the infant penguin overnight on 17 December last year. Some people claimed they had seen it, and in fact a reward of £25,000 has been offered, but Toga has not yet been found.

Kyala and Oscar spent weeks looking for their lost offspring but finally, on 19 January, they laid two eggs. One of them has proved to be infertile, and the other one hatched to produce the chick which still remains unnamed.

Derek Carson, the owner of Amazon World, said that the chick was only the second penguin which was born at the zoo, while Toga was the first. He added that Toga was destined to go to live in South Africa as part of a conservation programme but as he has gone, the new chick will now take his place.

Although it is possible to come close to the penguin family now, the sex of the animal is not known. It will be possible to determine it, and so to give the chick a proper name, when it grows feathers, which will happen in about eight weeks' time.

Tierra del Fuego is a group of islands at the southern tip of South America. Half of the main island, Isla Grande de Tierra del Fuego, belongs to Chile and the other half to Argentina. When the first Europeans arrived on the islands, there were several groups of people living there. These tribes were hunters. They didn't wear clothes before the Europeans arrived even though the climate of the island is very cold. They kept warm by covering their bodies in animal fat and by lighting fires. This is how the islands got their name: Tierra del Fuego means 'Land of Fire'.

The four main tribes of Tierra del Fuego looked similar to the Europeans, but they spoke different languages. One of these is Kaweskar, and it is now an endangered language. There are only about ten speakers on Tierra del Fuego and another ten on Wellington Island, south-west of Chile. However, Kaweskar is in a much healthier position than Yaghan. In 2002, there were about 1,685 Yaghan people living in Chile, but most of them don't speak the Yaghan language any more. In fact, in 2002 there were only two native speakers of this language. One of them died; this means that a woman called Cristina Calderón is now the last Yaghan speaker in the world. In 2005 she published a book of Yaghan stories called *Hai Kur Mamashu Shis*, which means 'I want to tell you a story'. The other two Fuegian languages, Ona and Haush, are related and they are very similar to each other. They are both part of the Chon group of languages. The last native speaker of Ona died in about 2003, so Ona is now a dead language. However, you can see examples of Ona words in online dictionaries and there are still a few people who understand it even though it isn't their first language. Haush died a long time ago and not much is known about it now. There is a third member of the Chon language family, Tehuelche, and experts think there are only four native speakers left. They don't live on Tierra del Fuego, but in Patagonia in Argentina.
