



Countries and Nationalities



People around the world come from many different countries. Each country has its own culture, food, language, and people. When we talk about where someone is from, we use the word country. When we talk about what nationality they are, we use the word nationality.

For example, if someone is from Japan, their nationality is Japanese. If someone is from Brazil, they are Brazilian. Let's look at more examples:

- Sarah is from Canada. She is Canadian.
- Tom is from Australia. He is Australian.
- Maria is from Spain. She is Spanish.
- Ken is from China. He is Chinese.
- Anna is from Germany. She is German.

Sometimes the nationality is very different from the country name. For example, people from the United Kingdom are called British, and people from Thailand are called Thai.

It is important to learn about countries and nationalities. It helps us understand more about other people and where they come from. It also helps us make friends from different parts of the world.
