Possessive Adjectives and Possessive Case

Possessive adjectives show ownership or possession. They tell us who something belongs to.

Possessive Adjective	Example	Explanation
My	This is my book	It belongs to me.
Your	Is this your sister?	She belongs to you.
His	Where is his toy?	The toy belongs to him.
Her	This is her cat.	The cat belongs to her.
Its	The ball is red, and its shape is round.	The round shape belongs to the ball.
Our	Look at our new puppy!	The puppy belongs to us.
Their	Are these their grandparents?	The grandparents belong to them.

Possessive Case

The **possessive case** is used to show ownership. We use an apostrophe and an "s" ('s) to indicate that something belongs to someone. Here are some examples using family and relationship words:

Possessive Case Examples	Explanation
John's father is a doctor.	The father belongs to John.
Maria's sister is coming.	The sister belongs to Maria.
The cat's tail is fluffy.	The tail belongs to the cat.
The children's toys are under their beds.	The toys belong to the children.
The students' backpacks are on the classroom floor.	The backpacks belong to the students.
The boss's instructions are clear.	The instructions belong to the boss.



"Whose" is like a detective word we use when we want to know who owns something. It helps us find out who a particular thing belongs to.

For example, "Whose book is this?"


