Is animal or plant protein better for bones and joints?

Animal protein provides calcium, which strengthens bones, (19) _____ which helps lower calcium loss through urine – both contributing to bone and joint health.

Sources of animal protein from meat, fish, milk, and eggs supply all the essential amino acids needed (20) _____. Milk is especially high in calcium, which enhances bone density, and animal products (21) _____ vitamin D, which improves calcium absorption. However, consuming excessive animal protein can increase calcium loss through urine. The body produces acid and carbon content in animal protein, which produces acid in the body and triggers calcium excretion. Without the sufficient intake of essential minerals, this can (22) _____ a calcium imbalance in bones.

Plant protein, (23) _____ in grains, legumes, and seeds, has the advantage of reducing dietary calcium loss. Foods rich in potassium, such as soybeans, chia seeds, and wheat, help maintain the body's pH balance, minimizing calcium depletion in bones.

Do you have a smartphone? Soon, you might never lose your hotel key or need to stop at the front desk again. That's the vision of a hotel chain planning to send digital keys directly to guests' phones through an app, eliminating the need for traditional plastic swipe cards. With this system, arriving guests can skip check-in and head straight to their rooms.

Starwood Hotels & Resorts, which operates over 1,150 hotels in nearly 100 countries, intends to launch the system within the next three months at two Aloft hotels: one in New York City's Harlem neighborhood and another in Cupertino, California. The choice of Cupertino is likely deliberate, as it's home to Apple's headquarters. If the trial is successful, the company aims to roll out the feature across all its hotels by next year.

Initially, the app will work with newer iPhone models (4S and later) and recent Android devices, using Bluetooth technology to unlock the room with a simple tap. "We believe this will become the new standard for hotel entry," Starwood CEO Frits van Paasschen explained to *The Wall Street Journal*. "It might feel novel at first, but we expect it will soon be essential for managing a hotel."
