

Chapter 5: Honesty always pays

Summary

- Bhola was a poor woodcutter who cut wood to earn money for his family.
- One day, his iron axe fell into the river, and he cried because he couldn't get it back.
- The river Goddess came out and showed him a golden axe, but Bhola said, "This is not mine."
- Next, she showed him a silver axe, but Bhola again said, "This is not mine either."
- When the Goddess gave him his old iron axe, Bhola jumped with joy and said, "This is my axe!"
- The Goddess was so happy with his honesty that she rewarded him with the golden and silver axes too.
- Moral: Always tell the truth, and you will be rewarded like Bhola!

Hindi Translation

अध्याय के बारे में: यह कहानी एक गरीब लकड़हारे के ईमानदार व्यवहार पर प्रकाश डालती है। आइए पढ़ें कि उसने अपनी ईमानदारी दिखाकर नदी देवी को कैसे खुश किया।

भोला एक गाँव में एक गरीब लकड़हारा था। वह अपने परिवार के लिए पैसे कमाने वाला एकमात्र व्यक्ति था। एक दिन जब वह नदी के किनारे एक पेड़ की सूखी शाखा काट रहा था, तो उसकी कुल्हाड़ी उसके हाथ से फिसल कर नदी में गिर गई। इसपर लकड़हारा जोर-जोर से रोने लगा।

उसी समय, नदी देवी बाहर आई और लकड़हारे को देखा। उन्होंने उसे एक सोने की कुल्हाड़ी दी। लेकिन लकड़हारे ने इसे लेने से इनकार कर दिया।

उसने कहा, "यह मेरी नहीं है"। तब नदी देवी ने उसे एक चांदी की कुल्हाड़ी दी।
