Quantifier	Form	Use
Some	Some + Plural countable noun Some + Uncountable noun	Positive sentences and offers/requests: We have <b>some</b> juice. / Would you like <b>some</b> coffee?
Any	Any + plural countable noun Any + uncountable noun	Negative sentences and questions: We don't have <b>any</b> apples. / Do you have <b>any</b> rice?
Much	Much + uncountable noun	Questions and negatives: How <b>much</b> milk is there? / There aren't <b>many</b> chairs.
Many	Many + plural countable noun	
A lot of / Lots of	A lot of/lots of + plural countable noun A lot of/lots of + uncountable noun	Positive sentences, informal speech: She has <b>a lot of</b> money. / They know <b>lots of</b> people.
