



The world of Shakespeare

Write **C** for comedy, **T** for tragedy and **H** for history play

They generally have a happy ending and huge celebrations.	
The hero makes a long speech talking to himself and showing his feelings to the audience.	
They make the audience think: "what makes a good king?" "How is power lost and won?"	
The protagonist lives unhappy or unfortunate situations.	
Jesters or jokers make comments about what is happening in the scenes.	
They act out historical events on stage, representing battles and power conflicts, for example Richard III.	
The hero or protagonist has to solve or fight many obstacles that threaten his life.	
There are generally dark, supernatural characters like ghosts, witches. One of them is Macbeth.	
They tell stories of noblemen and rulers (kings).	
There is violence and revenge between the characters.	
They show characters in funny, ridiculous and entertaining situations.	
Problems generally result in a character's death.	
There is romance, humour, puns and weddings.
