You are going to read a magazine article about a young mother whose house was burgled. (2 points for each question). For questions 1 – 7, choose the correct answer A, B, C or D.

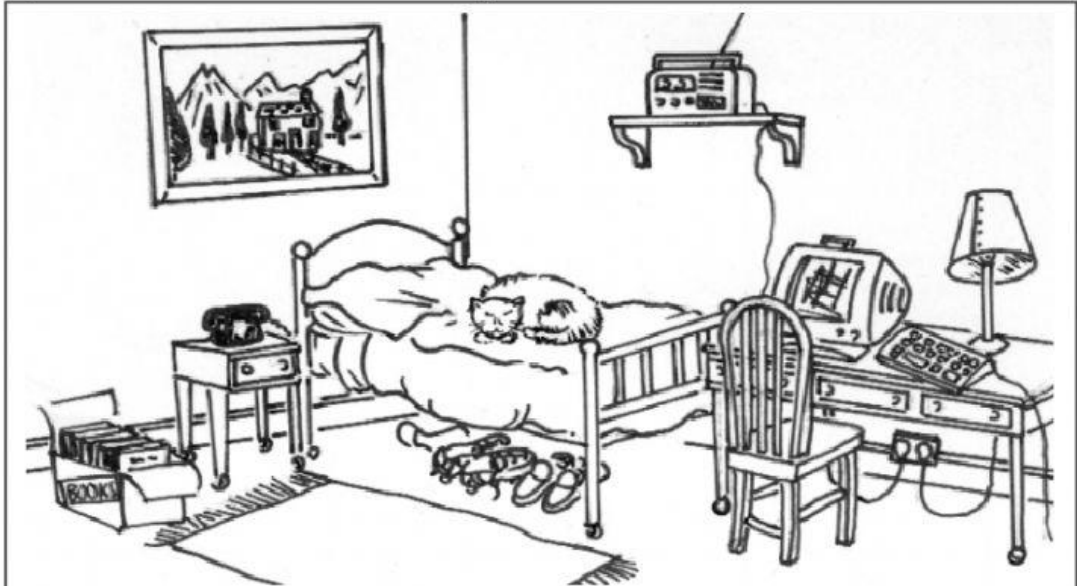

That's when she saw a leg coming out of the downstairs front window. It was a man climbing out. Lisa gasped in shock. The burglar was carrying her portable television! At this point, Lisa saw red. She didn't have many possessions and she'd saved long and hard to buy that set. Besides, nobody was going to stop her watching Friends. „Oh, no you don't," she muttered under her breath, as the fury swelled inside her. Without even stopping to think, she tore across the garden and started shouting at the burglar. „Give me my TV - drop it now!" she screamed. Ignoring her, the man fled across the garden.
