

## **Topic: A Day in the Life of Emma**

### **Grammar Focus: Simple Present – 3rd Person Singular**

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#### **Emma's Morning Routine**

Emma is a nurse. She works at a hospital in the city. Every morning, she wakes up at 6 a.m. and drinks a big cup of coffee. Then, she takes a quick shower and gets dressed. She usually eats cereal or toast for breakfast. At 7 a.m., she leaves her apartment and takes the bus to work. Her shift starts at 8 a.m., so she arrives early. Emma loves her job because she helps people and makes a difference. She checks patients, gives them medicine, and talks to their families. Emma often finishes work at 4 p.m. After work, she sometimes goes to the gym or watches a movie at home. On weekends, she visits her parents and bakes cakes with her mom. Emma is always busy, but she enjoys her routine.

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### **GRAMMAR: Simple Present – 3rd Person Singular**

In the simple present tense, we **add -s or -es** to the verb when the subject is **he, she, or it**.

#### **+ Affirmative:**

- He **works** at a hospital.
- She **likes** coffee.
- It **rains** a lot in April.

#### **— Negative:**

- He **does not (doesn't) work** on Sundays.
- She **doesn't eat** meat.

## ? Questions:

- **Does** he like his job?
- **Does** she go to the gym?

⚠ For verbs ending in **-ch, -sh, -x, -o, -ss**, add **-es**:

- She **watches** TV.
  - He **goes** to work.
  - He **passes** the ball.
