

Must, Mustn't, and Don't Have To

What do these words mean?

 **MUST = You HAVE TO do this (it's necessary)**

Example: You must wear a seatbelt in the car. *(This is the law - you have no choice)*




 **MUSTN'T = You are NOT ALLOWED to do this (it's forbidden)**

Example: You mustn't smoke in the hospital. *(This is not allowed - it's against the rules)*

 **DON'T HAVE TO = You can choose (it's not necessary)**

Example: You don't have to wear a tie to the party. *(You can wear one if you want, but it's not required)*

Easy Way to Remember:

Word	Meaning	Symbol
MUST	Required/Necessary	 You HAVE TO
MUSTN'T	Forbidden/Not allowed	 You CAN'T
DON'T HAVE TO	Optional/Your choice	 You CAN CHOOSE
