Four ways science fiction predicted the future

I've been a sci-fi fan all my life. When I was a kid, back in the 1960s, I watched TV shows about the future. I loved seeing the robots and gadgets, but I never imagined that they were possible. I was wrong. Lots of those things are now reality. But it seems sci-fi has always been good at predicting the future. Here are my top four examples.



- 1 Blogs and social media—predicted in 1835**
The author Vladimir Odoevsky imagined a future world in the year 4338. In this world, houses are connected by technology. Every day, the people in each house create a report about their lives and share the information with other houses. This sounds like the blogs and social media of today!



- 2 Credit cards—predicted in 1888**
In the novel *Looking Backward* by Edward Bellamy, each person has a card. They can use the card to buy things in stores. The first real credit cards didn't exist until 1950.



- 3 Cell phones—predicted in 1966**
The TV show *Star Trek* was popular in the 1960s. In the show, the people talked to each other with a device called a "communicator." This looked a lot like a cell phone. Twenty years later, the first cell phones went on sale.



- 4 Tablet computers—predicted in 1968**
In the movie *2001: A Space Odyssey*, people have a device called a Newspad. They use this to read information from all the world's newspapers. The device is very similar to modern tablets, which appeared about 40 years later.

So, can today's science fiction predict the future? In the TV shows I watch now, people can walk on Mars, they have robot teachers, and they become friends with the Artificial Intelligence (AI) on their phones. Is this likely? We will see!

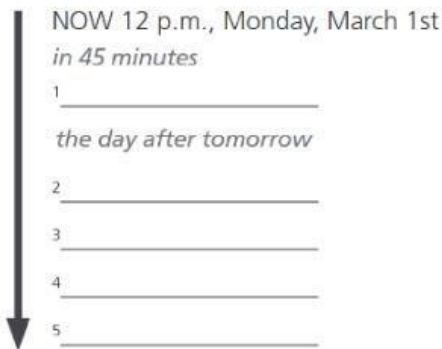
