3. Aims to highlight rare or unusual medical conditions or treatment outcomes. **CR / CS**
4. Seeks to test hypotheses and explore theoretical concepts. **CR / CS**
5. Follows a concise structure with introduction, case presentation, discussion, and conclusion. **CR / CS**
6. Often published in specialized medical journals related to medicine. **CR / CS**
7. Typically more flexible in structure, including methods, results, and discussion sections. **CR / CS**
8. Documents unique clinical phenomena or adverse effects. **CR / CS**
9. Aims to understand why and how something happened in a broader context. **CR / CS**
10. May be found in a variety of academic or professional journals across disciplines. **CR / CS**
