

Simple, Compound, Complex

SIMPLE, COMPOUND AND COMPLEX SENTENCES
Simple A sentence with one <u>subject</u> and one <u>verb</u> . <u>Donna</u> <u>went</u> to the store.
Compound Two simple sentences put together with a comma and a linking word. <u>Donna</u> <u>went</u> to the store, and <u>Jerry</u> <u>went</u> home.
Complex One simple sentence, with linking word and a sentence fragment (not a full sentence). <u>Donna</u> <u>went</u> to the store, but forgot milk.

1. The cat slept under the bed.
2. I went to the store, but it was already closed.
3. When the rain stopped, we went outside to play.
4. The phone rang loudly.
5. She opened the window because it was hot inside.
6. James and Maria went to the zoo on Saturday.
7. The baby cried, and her mother picked her up.
