You've probably sprained a joint like your wrist, elbow, or ankle at some point in your life. But what happens when you sprain a joint, and what can you do to recover from a sprain?

A sprain occurs when a ligament, the tough tissue that joins two bones together, is stretched too far. Ligaments cross over joints, and they can be overstretched when we move a joint in an awkward way. This overstretching causes some of the tissue in the ligament to tear. Once it tears, blood collects in the area of the joint, which causes it to swell. Special cells in the blood also release chemicals that help to remove the damaged tissue and to make new tissue.

To recover from a sprain, there are a few things that you can do. For the first two days, try not to move the joint. You should apply ice to it, wrap it, and keep it elevated. This will reduce the swelling and help the new ligament tissue to form. After two days, though, you should begin to use the sprained joint carefully. Doing so will help to strengthen the new tissue. If you follow these steps, you should make a full recovery.

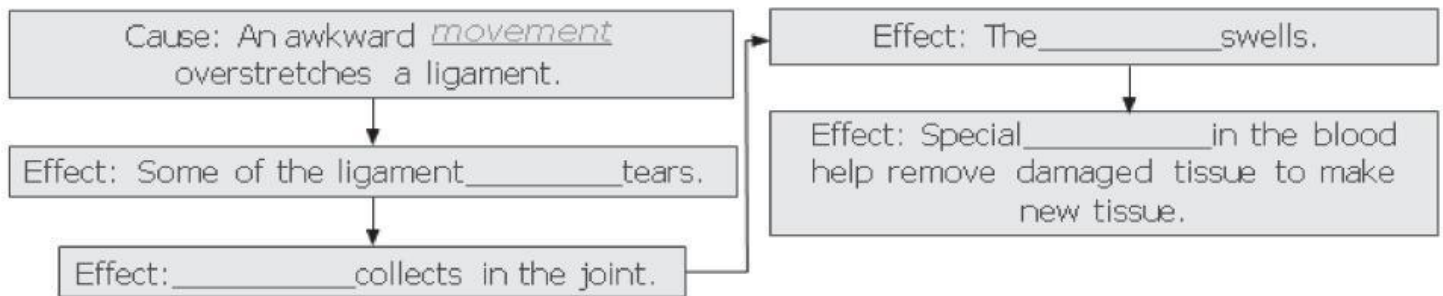
