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Grammar Mini Lesson: First Conditional

What is the First Conditional?

We use the **First Conditional** to talk about **possible** and **real situations in the future**.

It describes what **will happen if something else happens**.

Structure:

If + Present Simple, will + base verb

● *If it rains, the stadium will close its roof.*

● *If you stay at home, you will watch the game in 3D.*

Examples from the text:

If-Clause (Condition) Main Clause (Result)

If it rains the stadium will close its roof

If you stay at home you will watch the game in 3D

If players train hard they will become champions

Remember:

- The **"if" part** uses **present simple** (NOT future!):
✓ If it rains ✗ If it will rain
 - The **result part** uses **will + verb**:
✓ the stadium **will close** ✗ the stadium **closes**
