Cybercriminals are becoming more skilled at tricking people into sharing personal information, especially through fake emails and websites. With the help of AI, these scams (often blackmail) are more convincing and harder to detect. Gmail accounts are particularly targeted because they are linked to other Google services, storing large amounts of personal data. Once a hacker gains access, they can send out emails, saved passwords, files, and even financial information.

Phishing scams – where attackers trick individuals into **revealing** personal details – are now easier to create, even for those with minimal technical skills. AI tools allow scammers to generate fake emails and websites

that look real, making it harder for people to spot fraudulent attempts. As a result, more individuals are unknowingly falling victim.

To protect yourself, be cautious when dealing with emails from unknown senders. Don't click on links in **suspicious** messages; instead, manually type the website's address into your browser. Use a password manager to help you access only legal sites. Regularly monitor your accounts and enable two-factor authentication for added security. Never share sensitive information via email, even if it appears to come from a trusted source. If you receive a suspicious email, check your Google Account directly for security concerns. Stay alert!
