Ex:

I will see you tomorrow. → I won't see you

**Your friend will be jealous.** ( bạn của bạn sẽ rất ghen tỵ)

( **dự định không chắc chắn / lời hứa hẹn / một dự đoán không có cơ sở**)

I am going to see you tomorrow

**Your friend is going to be jealous** ( because I refused to see him yesterday)

( **dự định hơi chắc chắn, dự đoán có cơ sở**)

I am seeing you tomorrow.

( **dự định rất chắc chắn 100%**)

He will fall from the chair. (trù èo)

He is going to fall from the chair. ( có căn cứ - nhìn thấy người bị mất thăng bằng)

- Will + V : **dự định không chắc chắn / lời hứa hẹn / một dự đoán không có cơ sở**

- Be Going to + V : ( **dự định hơi chắc chắn, dự đoán có cơ sở**)

- Hiện tại tiếp diễn ( **dự định rất chắc chắn 100% trong tương lai** )

• Shall với "I/We" > dùng để đề nghị/ yêu cầu, rủ rê

• Shall I clean the table?

• Shall we go to the movies tonight?
