

Everybody here is friendly and the coaches are excellent – they do everything possible to help you become a better player. Fortunately, I'm quite a confident and sociable person and I've made lots of friends here at the academy.

There is a very strict training programme here at Ajax. We have to train four times a week. The training sessions take place in the afternoons and they organize special buses to take the Youth Academy players to the training complex from the city centre. The training is very tiring but I don't mind it because I love playing football and I want to become a better player. If I didn't enjoy it so much, I wouldn't do it! The best thing about being in the academy are the matches. We have a match every weekend. Last Sunday we beat a team from Eindhoven 4–0 and I scored two of the goals!

Although I spend most of my free time playing football, I also work very hard at school and I'm hoping to do well in my exams at the end of the year. It's hard to find the time to study when you're spending 12–15 hours a week playing football. When I get home after training or playing a match I usually feel pretty tired. The last thing I want to do is to open my schoolbooks and start studying – I just want to watch TV! However, my parents have told me that unless I continue to do well at school, I won't be allowed to stay at the Ajax Academy, so I have to show them that I am able to study hard as well as play hard.

Anyway, I realize that Ajax might not offer me a professional contract when I'm eighteen. In fact, very few of the players in the academy will become full-time professionals when they're older. If I don't become a professional footballer with Ajax, I'll go to university to study Medicine. And if I go to university, my footballing days won't be over. There will definitely be a university football team I can join!
