

FIRST CONDITIONAL

The first conditional is always used to talk about a future that is very likely to happen.

Take a look at the following sentence:

IF you **PAY** attention in class, you **WILL PASS** the exam.

The conditional clause or IF clause is always in the present simple tense.

IF + Present Simple		
AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
I do gymnastics	I don't do gymnastics	Do I do gymnastics?
You do gymnastics	You don't do gymnastics	Do you do gymnastics?
He does gymnastics	He doesn't do gymnastics	Does he do gymnastics?
She does gymnastics	She doesn't do gymnastics	Does she do gymnastics?
It does gymnastics	It doesn't do gymnastics	Does it do gymnastics?
We do gymnastics	We don't do gymnastics	Do we do gymnastics?
They do gymnastics	They don't do gymnastics	Do they do gymnastics?

The resulting clause is always in the simple future tense (will).

FUTURE SIMPLE (WILL)		
AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
I will do gymnastics	I won't do gymnastics	Will I do gymnastics?
You will do gymnastics	You won't do gymnastics	Will you do gymnastics?
He will do gymnastics	He won't do gymnastics	Will he do gymnastics?
She will do gymnastics	She won't do gymnastics	Will she do gymnastics?
It will do gymnastics	It won't do gymnastics	Will it do gymnastics?
We will do gymnastics	We won't do gymnastics	Will we do gymnastics?
They will do gymnastics	They won't do gymnastics	Will they do gymnastics?
