

A Twist in the Script

We use the second conditional to talk about **imaginary or unlikely situations** in the present or future.

Structure:

If + past simple, would + base verb

- If Jake didn't break his leg, they would finish the scene.
- If I were Anna, I would rewrite the script.

Note: Use “were” for all subjects in more formal English (If I **were** you...).
