Celebrities

Marie Curie

Marie Curie was a physicist and chemist from Poland. She was the first woman to receive, not only one Nobel Prize, but two, and the first woman to become a professor at Sorbonne University. She was born in Warsaw in 1867 and moved to Paris to study at the age of 24, following in the footsteps of an older sister. There she met her future husband Pierre Curie, with whom she shared her first Nobel Prize in 1903, and became a French citizen. Among her achievements are: the discovery of two new elements, radium and polonium, the latter being named after her native country, and her research about the use of radioactivity, a name she came up with, to treat cancer. Ironically, she died in 1934 of leukemia, which was brought on her long-time exposure to radiation. Her last accomplishment came after her death, she being the first woman to be entombed in the Pantheon in Paris because of her own merits.
