Third Conditional

If + subject + past perfect , subject + would have + past participle + complement.

If I had studied, I would have passed the test.

Meaning: I didn't study → I failed.

If she hadn't been sick, she would have gone to the concert.

Meaning: She was sick → She didn't go.
