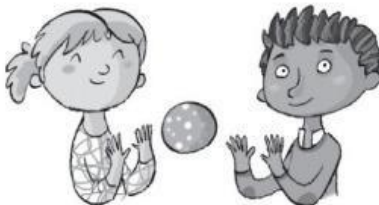

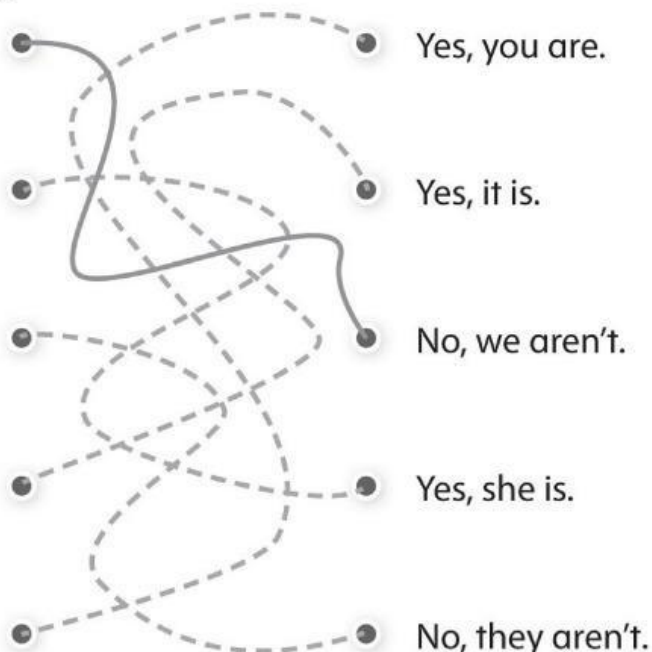

's = is isn't = is not

're = are aren't = are not
