

Vowel pronunciation rules for A, E, I, O, U, Y according to 4 types

 *Sort the words by vowel pronunciation type*

Task:

Read the words from the list and sort them into the correct column in the table according to the type of vowel pronunciation:

1. **Open stressed syllable** - the vowel is followed by a consonant + silent "e" or another vowel. It is usually a long sound.
Example: name, Pete, cube
2. **Closed syllable** - the vowel is between two consonants. It is usually a short sound.
Example: map, pen, sit
3. **Before the letter R** - the vowel comes before the letter **r** and is pronounced with a long or special "r-colored" sound.
Example: car, her, burn
4. **Words ending in -re** - these words often have an unstressed vowel or a diphthong before -re.
Example: care, more, explore

Remember: each word belongs to **only one** type!
