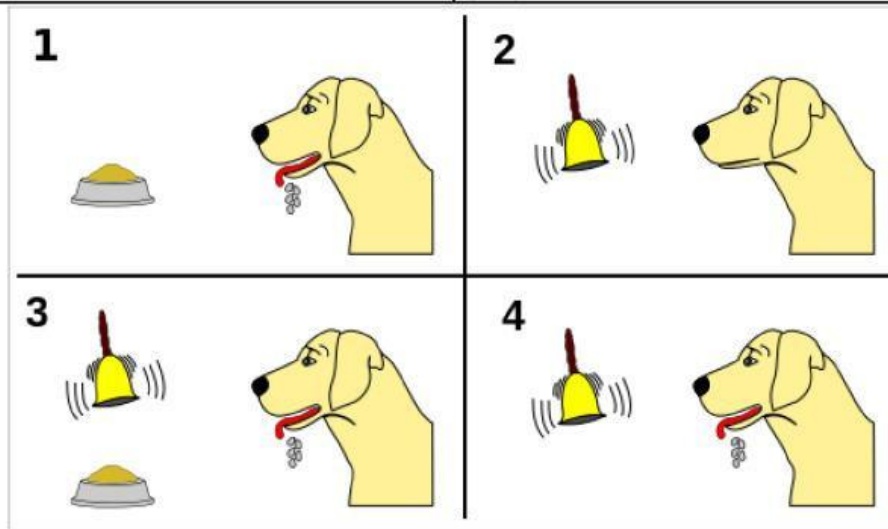


Classical Conditioning Practice
