6 – Word Stories

The famous author **Ernest Hemingway** was known for putting a lot of meaning in as few words as possible. A friend once bet him 10 dollars that he couldn't write a complete **short story in just ten words**.

Hemingway came back with a story in **six** words:

“For sale: Baby shoes, never worn.”

This is a complete story with a **beginning**, a central **turn** and an **end**. But none of these are actually written. When you understand the text and the situation it belongs to, everything about the story becomes clear. Because it is Hemingway, the story is very dark. He won the 10 dollars.

As a by-product, this anecdote has given us the genre of six-word-stories.
