

Obama Kicks Off Mandela's 100th Birthday Celebration

South [redacted] and freedom fighters around the world celebrated the birth and life of Nelson Mandela this Wednesday. Mandela's [redacted] has been recognized as Mandela Day since 2010, but this year marked 100 years since the former South African president's birth.
