

## First and Second Conditional Practice

**Instructions:** Complete the sentences with the correct form of the verb in parentheses. Use the **first** or **second conditional** as appropriate. Use the **positive** or **negative** form as needed.

**First Conditional** – for real or possible situations in the **present or future**

**Form:** *If + simple present, will + base verb*

**Example:** If it rains, we **will stay** inside.

**Second Conditional** – for unreal, unlikely, or imaginary situations in the **present or future**

**Form:** *If + simple past, would + base verb*

**Example:** If I had a car, I **would drive** to work.
