Tucumán: the Core of the Independence

Every year on July 9th, people in Argentina celebrate Independence Day. On this day in 1816, Argentina became independent from Spain. The event took place in San Miguel de Tucumán, in the famous "Casa Histórica" (Historical House), where the leaders signed the Declaration of Independence of the United Provinces of South America. This is why people say that Tucumán is more important than other provinces when we talk about the birth of the nation. Today, the Historical House is a museum and it is more visited than many other museums in the region.

On Independence Day, Tucumán becomes more festive than usual. There are parades, music, and events to celebrate this special moment. Since these celebrations take place in winter people spend less time outside, but they still reunite in Independence Square, a special place where people meet and enjoy the view of buildings like the Government House, the Cathedral, and the Mercedes Sosa Theater.

Every 9th of July, people eat more traditional food than on other days. They start by having breakfast with hot chocolate and facturas. Following the line of this patriotic date, for lunch, locro is one of the main dishes, along with asado, humita and empanadas. Many people say that empanadas here are more delicious than others in the country. According to locals, the ranking of dishes are: asado, empanadas and locro.
