The high cost of living is the first disadvantage. The bigger the city is, the higher the living cost is. Accommodation and petrol are expensive. Food and drinks are also pricey. Apart from that, city people seem to suffer from more , noise and air pollution. The densely populated neighbourhoods, busy traffic, and big construction sites make cities noisy and dusty.
