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## Model Answers and Explanations

### Question 1

Correct Answer: C

Explanation: The subject of the sentence is "collection" (singular), not "stamps." The phrase "of rare stamps" is a prepositional phrase and should be crossed out when identifying the subject. Therefore, the singular verb "was" is needed to agree with "collection."

### Question 2

Correct Answer: B

Explanation: This sentence features a compound subject: "reducing unemployment and stimulating economic growth." When subjects are joined by "and," they typically take a plural verb. Therefore, "stand" is the correct plural verb.

### Question 3

Correct Answer: B

Explanation: This sentence uses "Neither...nor." According to the "Or/Nor Rule," the verb agrees with the subject closest to it. In this case, "players" (plural) is closest to the verb, so the plural verb "are happy" is correct.

### Question 4

Correct Answer: B

Explanation: The subject of the sentence is "details" (plural), not "pottery." The phrase "on the ancient pottery" and the clause "discovered by archaeologists in the desert" are modifiers that come between the subject and the verb. Therefore, the plural verb "provide" is needed to agree with "details."

### Question 5

Correct Answer: B

Explanation: "Each" is always a singular pronoun, even when followed by a prepositional phrase like "of the students." Therefore, the singular verb "has demonstrated" is correct.

#### Question 6

Correct Answer: B

Explanation: The subject is "policy" (singular). The phrase "along with several other initiatives" is an additive phrase and does not make the subject plural. Therefore, the singular verb "aims to improve" is correct.

#### Question 7

Correct Answer: B

Explanation: The phrase "a number of" acts as a plural quantifier, meaning "many." Therefore, "factors" is treated as a plural subject, and the plural verb "contribute to" is correct. (If it were "the number of," it would be singular.)

#### Question 8

Correct Answer: B

Explanation: The subject of the sentence is "reason" (singular), not "struggles." The phrase "for the team's struggles" is a prepositional phrase. Therefore, the singular verb "is a lack" is needed to agree with "reason."

#### Question 9

Correct Answer: B

Explanation: This sentence has a compound subject: "the director and the lead actress." When two subjects are joined by "and," they typically take a plural verb. Therefore, "were honored" is the correct plural verb.

#### Question 10

Correct Answer: B
