Brooklyn 99 is a popular American comedy series that follows a team of detectives at the 99th police precinct in Brooklyn, New York. The main character, Jake Peralta, is a talented but childish detective who often solves serious crimes in

very unusual and funny ways.

In one of the most famous scenes of the show, Detective Jake is investigating a **murder case**. A woman comes to the police station and says that she is the **witness** to her brother's murder. However, she didn't see the **killer's face**. The only thing she remembers is the man's **voice**.

There is a moment of silence. Jake, a bit embarrassed for getting distracted, replies:

“Oh right, yeah... I totally forgot about the murder.”

This scene became viral because it mixes humor with a serious situation. It shows how creative and untraditional Detective Jake can be when solving a case.
