At this time of year, many students are absent because they are ill. To avoid this, please follow these tips:

- 5 • You should exercise regularly and eat healthily. This is the golden rule for staying healthy.
- 10 • Make sure you get enough sleep – you should go to bed early and you should not take your mobile phone or tablet with you.
- 15 • If you have the flu and / or a fever, you should not come to school. If you have a cough or cold, you should wear a mask to school. If you forget to bring a mask, you can buy one from the school office.
- 20 • If you need to cough or sneeze, you should cover your mouth and nose with a tissue. Put dirty tissues into the bin as soon as possible. Use hand gel to clean your hands.

Last term we had a number of accidents in school. Five pupils hurt themselves when they fell over school bags. You should put your bag under your chair, not in the middle of the floor where someone can trip over it. Another pupil was running up the stairs when she crashed into a pupil on her way down.
