Commas are placed before “but” and “and” only if there are two complete sentences on either side. Commas can combine two sentences into one sentence. Draw a comma and add “but” or “and”.

I like pickles, <sup>+</sup> but I don’t like cucumbers. <sup>-</sup>

I like burgers      I don’t like cheeseburgers.

I like animals, <sup>+</sup> and it’s so nice to hike. <sup>+</sup>

I like cats      I really like that they’re soft.

I enjoy walking      I am just not a runner.

She was looking hard      she couldn’t find it.

He seems nice      he doesn’t enjoy kayaking.

I love lettuce      I love spinach as well.

Jack climbed up      it was dry at the top.

I fell off my bike      I will be okay.
