

SUBJECT & OBJECT QUESTIONS

IN ENGLISH, WE CAN ASK ABOUT:

1. THE SUBJECT – WHO/WHAT DOES THE ACTION?
2. THE OBJECT (COMPLEMENT) – WHO/WHAT RECEIVES THE ACTION?

examples:

Tom works in a factory.

Who works in a factory?

Object (complement)

Where does Tom work?

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Statement: Emily reads books.

Subject Question: (Who does the action?)

► Who reads books? (Emily)

Object Question: (What does she read?)

► What does Emily read? (books)

Present Simple

Statement: Tom painted a picture.

Subject Question:

► Who painted a picture? (Tom)

Object Question:

► What did Tom paint? (a picture)

Past Simple

Statement: Sarah is watching a movie.

Subject Question:

► Who is watching a movie? (Sarah)

Object Question:

► What is Sarah watching? (a movie)

Present Continuous

Tips:

1. **Subject Questions:** No auxiliary verb (do/does/did), just "Who" or "What" + verb.
2. **Object Questions:** Use auxiliary verb (do/does/did) or the correct form of "to be".

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Uwaga: jeśli podmiot to rzecz (np. "This phone"), można użyć "What".
