



Vocabulary review:

1. **spine-tingling**: very frightening or exciting in a way that you enjoy.
2. **ghost story**: a story about the spirit of a dead person that sb hears or sees.
3. **on the edge of your seat**: very excited and interested in sth.
4. **set**: the scenery and furniture used in a play, film, etc.
5. **sound effects**: sounds that are made artificially in a play, film, etc. to make it more realistic, e.g. wind, thunder.
6. **scare sb out of their wits**: frighten sb very much.
7. **nail-biting**: making you very excited or worried. SYN **gripping**.
8. **adaptation**: a book or play that has been made into a film, TV programme, etc.
9. **twist**: an unexpected change or development in a story or situation.
10. **cast**: (+ SING or PL V) all the people who act in a play or film.
11. **sensational**: INF extremely good; wonderful. SYNS **fabulous**, **brilliant**.
12. **applause**: the sound of an audience (people watching a play, etc.) showing approval by hitting their hands together. **applaud** V. SYN **clap**.
13. **phenomenally**: in a very great or impressive way. SYN **extraordinarily**.
14. **unanimously**: in a way that is agreed by everyone. **unanimous** ADJ.
15. **acclaimed**: publicly talked or written about in an admiring way. **acclaim** N.
16. **atrocious**: very bad and unpleasant. SYN **dire** INF.
17. **sentimental**: OFTEN DISAPPROVING making people experience feelings of sadness, sympathy, etc. in a deliberate and obvious way.
18. **cliché**: a phrase or idea that has been used so often it no longer has much meaning and is not interesting. **clichéd** ADJ.
19. **shallow**: not showing serious thought, feelings, etc. SYN **superficial**.
20. **feeble**: very weak.
21. **wooden**: not showing enough natural expression, emotion, or movement.
22. **mediocre**: of only average quality.
23. **miscast**: (of an actor) not suitable for the role they have been given.
24. **unconvincing**: not seeming true or real. OPP **convincing**.
25. **utter**: complete (used to emphasize sth, usually sth bad) (an **utter waste of time**, **utter rubbish/nonsense**).
26. **rubbish**: INF We say sth is **rubbish** if we think it is of poor quality.
27. **impulse (to do sth)**: a sudden desire to do sth without thinking about the results (buy sth on impulse).
28. **in search of sth**: looking for sth.
29. **price tag**: a label on sth which shows how much you must pay.

30. **shop till you drop**: MODERN IDIOM spend a long time shopping because you don't want to stop (till = until).
31. **browse**: casually look at things in a shop, or look through the pages of a book.
32. **after sth**: looking for and trying to obtain sth (**after a jacket** / **after a job**).
33. **the minute**: as soon as. SYN **the moment**.
34. **be off**: go; leave.
35. **have an eye for sth**: have a natural ability to see or find sth (to **have your eye on sth** is to have seen sth and want to have it or buy it).
36. **shop around**: go to different shops until you find what you want.
37. **focused**: having a very clear aim; knowing what you want to do.
38. **be distracted by sth**: be looking at or thinking about sth so that you are unable to pay attention to other things. **distract sb from sth** V.
39. • **pursuit**: SYNS hobby, pastime (leisure/outdoor pursuits).
40. • **spree**: a short period of time doing one activity, often in an uncontrolled way (spending/shopping spree).
41. • **bargain hunting**: looking for sth at a good price and cheaper than usual.
42. • **head for/towards**: go in the direction of.
43. • **indulge in sth**: do sth you like, especially sth that is bad for you.
44. • **gadget**: a small tool or piece of equipment that does sth useful.
45. • **shopaholic**: INF sb who enjoys shopping and spends a lot of time doing it (also workaholic/chocoholic; see alcoholic below).
46. • **compulsive**: a compulsive person finds it difficult to control their actions (a compulsive shopper/gambler/liar).
47. • **addicted to sth**: unable to stop doing sth which is usually harmful (addicted to drugs/alcohol; a person is a drug addict or an alcoholic).
48. • **crippling**: very serious (crippling debts/disease).
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59. • **pop round/over/in**: INF go somewhere quickly or for a fairly short time.
60. • **fancy sth**: INF want sth or want to do sth.
61. • **no doubt**: used to say you expect sth will happen.
62. • **drunk**: having drunk too much alcohol (get/be drunk).
63. • **awkward**: not relaxed or comfortable with other people.
64. • **loner**: a person who is often alone and usually prefers to be alone.
65. • **get-together**: a friendly informal meeting or party. SYN do N, INF.
66. • **join in**: take part in an activity with other people.
67. • **warm welcome**: If sb gives you a warm welcome you feel relaxed in their home. welcome ADJ (make sb feel welcome).
68. • **cliquey**: INF, DISAPPROVING forming a small group and not letting others join in. Clique N.
69. • **habitat**: the place where a plant or animal is usually found (natural habitat).
70. • **deforestation**: the act of clearing forests (= removing trees).
71. • **endangered species**: endangered in danger because numbers are falling. species a group of animals, plants, etc. whose members are similar and can breed with each other.
72. • **under threat (of sth)**: likely to be harmed or damaged; also threatened with sth.
73. • **reserve**: a protected area for plants, animals, etc. (a wildlife/nature reserve).
74. • **in the wild**: in a natural environment not controlled by people.
75. • **in captivity**: kept in a zoo or park, etc.
76. • **in decline**: continuously decreasing in number, quantity, etc. (gradual/steady decline).
77. • **breed v**: 1 (of animals) have sex and produce young. 2 keep animals in order for them to produce young.
78. • **wipe sb/sth out**: destroy or get rid of sth completely.
79. • **die out**: become less common and eventually disappear.
80. • **socialize**: spend time with other people in a friendly way. sociable ADJ.
81. • **host**: a person who is giving a meal or a party (hostess can be used for a woman).
82. • **lay sth on**: INF provide sth for sb, especially food, drink, or transport.
83. • **time-consuming**: needing a lot of time (a time-consuming process).
84. • **contribution**: a thing that you give or do to help sth be successful (make a valuable/significant contribution). contribute V.
85. • **clear (sth) up**: leave everything clean and tidy.
86. • **disposable**: intended to be used once or twice then thrown away.
87. • **beforehand**: before sth else happens or is done.

88. • **gatecrasher**: a person who tries to get into a party without an invitation.
89. • **warm up**: (of a party or event) start to become interesting and enjoyable.
90. • **deafening**: very loud.
91. • **drown sth out**: be louder than other sounds, so they can't be heard.
92. • **liven sth up**: make sth more exciting (liven up = become more exciting).
93. • **get/be carried away**: become very excited or lose control of your feelings.
94. • **flee (from) sth/sb**: escape from a dangerous situation, place, or person very quickly.
95. • **refugee**: a person who is forced to leave their country for political/religious reasons.
96. • **seek/take refuge (from sth/sb)**: find shelter or protection from trouble or danger.
97. • **(political) asylum**: the protection a country gives to a refugee (seek asylum, apply for asylum).
98. • **ethnic minority**: a group of people with the same culture or race living in a place where most people are of a different culture/race.
99. • **ethnic group**: a group of people with the same culture or race living in a place where most people are of a different culture/race.
100. • **be uprooted**: be made to leave the place where you live and go somewhere else.
101. • **discrimination**: the practice of treating a person or group in society less fairly than others.
102. • **discriminate v**: the practice of treating a person or group in society less fairly than others.
103. • **deport sb**: force sb to leave a country, often because they have no right to be there.
104. • **deportation N**: force sb to leave a country, often because they have no right to be there.
105. • **prejudice (against sb/sth)**: an opinion about sb/sth that is not based on reason or experience, especially a dislike based on race, religion, etc.
106. • **prejudiced ADJ**: an opinion about sb/sth that is not based on reason or experience, especially a dislike based on race, religion, etc.
107. • **era**: a period of time that has a particular quality or character.
108. • **advance(s) (in sth)**: progress made in science, medicine, technology, etc.
109. • **decade**: a period of ten years.
110. • **conventional**: usual or traditional; not new or different. convention N.
111. • **diagnostic**: used for finding out what physical or mental problem sb has. diagnose v. diagnosis N.
112. • **restrict sth (to sth)**: limit the size, number, or amount of sth. restriction N.
113. • **prone to sth**: likely to suffer from sth (also accident-prone).
114. • **cure**: a medical treatment that makes a sick person well again. cure v. curable ADJ. OPP incurable.
115. • **vaccine**: a substance which is put into the blood and protects the body from disease (the process of giving vaccine is vaccination N). vaccinate v.
116. • **eradicate sth**: destroy or get rid of sth (bad) completely. SYN wipe sth out.

117. • **condition:** a long-term illness or medical problem.
118. • **be confined to bed / a wheelchair:** have to stay in bed / a wheelchair.
119. • **invasive:** (of medical treatment) involving cutting of the body. invasion N. invade v.
120. • **procedure:** a medical operation or investigation (carry out / perform a procedure).
121. • **organ:** a part of the body that has a particular purpose, such as the heart or brain.
122. • **transplant:** an operation in which a damaged organ is replaced with one from a donor (= sb who gives part of their body, blood, etc.). transplant v.
123. • **resume sth:** FML begin sth again after an interruption. resumption N.
124. • **chemotherapy:** the treatment of diseases, especially cancer, by drugs.
125. • **native:** connected with the place where you were born and lived for the first years of your life (native country/land/city).
126. • **culture shock:** a feeling of confusion and anxiety often felt by people staying in another country.
127. • **animosity (towards sb):** a feeling of anger or hatred. SYN hostility.
128. • **faith:** a strong belief in sth (this is often a religious faith).
129. • **stereotype:** a fixed idea of what a particular type of person or thing is like, but which is often not true in reality. stereotypical ADJ.
130. • **integration:** the process of becoming a full member of a group or society. integrate (into sth).
131. • **live at peace with sb:** live without quarrelling with others.
132. • **nostalgia:** a feeling of sadness mixed with pleasure when you think of happy times in the past. nostalgic ADJ.
133. • **desire:** a strong wish (have no desire to do sth).
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
